Nangara Reserve

Nangara Reserve is a 14 hectare reserve, formerly a quarry, located 3km south west of Jindivick and adjoining the Bunyip State Park.

Nangara means “meeting of the waters,” and the reserve forms part of the headwaters to the Labertouche Creek that runs south west to the Tarago River and then the Bunyip River. Indigenous culture is an important part of the reserve and the local area.

The reserve has lots of short tracks (some steep sections) that feature art installations, interpretive signage and access to the Bunyip State Park.

Distance: Approximately 2km, 45 minutes return

Jindivick to Nangara Bridle Trail

This horse riding track travels west from opposite West Jindivick Road along Jacksons Track to the Jacksons Track entrance of Nangara Reserve. The trail involves road crossings so take your time and watch out for traffic along the route.

Distance: 1.8km one way



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
