Nangara News

Lyrebirds in Nangara Reserve, by Peter Ware Winter is probably the best time to hear and see one of



Nangara's special birds: the Superb Lyrebird. Male Lyrebirds begin singing and displaying to attract females in mid to late winter. Living in the rainforests of SE Australia from the Q'land-NSW border to

just east of Melbourne, lyrebirds are sedentary ground dwelling birds, that roost and nest in trees and tree ferns. There are at least two pair of Lyrebirds in Nangara. One pair occupy the bottom of the park in the bush adjacent the bottom dam, a 2nd pair are often in the bush below the Bunyip State Park track at the top of the park. There could well be more as their calls often come from gullies on private property adjoining reserve.

Lyrebird mimicry is legendary - on one occasion in 2016, while visiting Nangara early one winter's morning, I could hear 'someone chopping wood with an axe' near the intersection of Nangara Loop and Quarry Tracks. I was fooled into believing that I'd come across an illegal wood collector, until the penny dropped.
