Rain, rain, rain and a touch of sunshine. Hmmm....183mm of rain last month...sounds like a dry year to me! A lot of skill required to avoid getting bogged while egg collecting, but boy, is the grass growing. A lustrous sweet pick of pasture that waves in the breeze with the rye grass glistening in the late afternoon sun. And there lies the dilemma; we can't gobble it up fast enough! We are well known for our yellow yolks from all the grass we devour and it's our job to keep the farm neat and trim, but it's getting away from us. The lambs born last month are now giving it a good munch but we are going to have to call in the big boys.

Yes, new cattle are being sort after to take care of the excess. Funny things, cows. They get into all sorts of mischief and shenanigans. I guess when you are as big as they are, you can do whatever you like! Old Clucker told me once about a steer who could open the egg collection car door with his tongue and stick his head inside. Another one used to lick at the taps until he would unwind them completely off the riser pipe and flood the paddock. Lol, what fun that would have been to splash about in. One Christmas Day a heifer decided to visit by jumping 3 fences to join our herd. We called her 'Santa'. Sometimes they walk straight through our fence to get a closer look at our living quarters. Now that's scary because they are huge up close. So scary that a girl could lay a pre-scrambled egg!

The cattle eat all the long grass so it's a good length for the sheep. The sheep then take it down to the perfect length for us chickens. They know just how we like it so we get all the fresh shoots and don't get lost in the long grass. Lucky Clucker 500, Jindi Free Range Eggs, over and moo to you all.

Jindivick Progress Association – Annual General Meeting was held in the Hall on September 16.

The approx. 16 attendees agreed that the JPA would continue without an elected committee, hold a minimum of 3 meetings per year, and that Lindsay Linnell continue as Treasurer. Discussion focused on the Baw Baw Shire 's various plans for Jindivick, including the Placemaking Project activities to date, and the validity of suggested improvements. It was agreed that the JPA would write to council expressing its views about the various plans and seeking a more formal community consultation process to determine options for the Placemaking Project. Since the meeting Cr. Tricia Jones has contacted the JPA indicating that "Council will host a community meeting in Jindivick to seek consensus on the proposed Placemaking projects. This meeting will provide all residents an opportunity to raise concerns and provide feedback. The date will be advised soon."

The Jindivick Country Market recommences on October 5 and we are looking forward to great weather and over 30 interesting stalls in the spring period.

New stalls include jewellery, paintings, goat soaps and other products, baby care products as well as the market's usual great range of products including potatoes, preserves, cakes and slices, hand crafts and wine and cheese.

Nangara Notes – Clever Cuckoos

The first cuckoo for the season was heard recently in Nangara Reserve. The rather mournful descending trill of the Fan-tailed Cuckoo is a popular harbinger of spring for many bird watchers.



We get visits from several species of cuckoos here in Gippsland, each preferring their own habitat and host species.

Fan-tailed Cuckoos (left) migrate up and down the eastern seaboard, arriving here just in time for the nesting of their favourite nest-hoster. Cuckoos lay a

single egg in the nest of other birds and allow their young to be reared by the unwitting host.

The cuckoo's egg is timed to hatch earlier than the host's eggs and the young cuckoo hatchling is programmed to eject the other eggs from the nest. Fan-tailed Cuckoos seem to prefer to parasitize the dome-shaped nests of species such as fairy wrens and thornbills, birds that are much smaller than the cuckoo. As the baby cuckoo grows, the sight of the much smaller host-parent feeding the larger cuckoo baby can appear bizarre.

Grubs and caterpillars are favourite foods of the Fan-tailed Cuckoo although they will take an array of arthropods. Like many of our native birds, Fan-tailed Cuckoos are nearly always heard before they are seen, and can sit still on an exposed branch for long periods before they are noticed.

This interactive forum is specifically designed for residents of Jindivick, Drouin West, Crossover, Rokeby and surrounding areas.
