# **Chainsaw Safety Course**


By the time you read this quite a number of Jindivick residents will have completed JINDIVICK a chainsaw safety course in Drouin. We have a few spaces available on Fri

### Anita's Magical Mango Cheesecake

Christmas day weather can often be a challenge, being either a tad chilly, or a scorcher here in Jindivick. Come December, 2 weeks out from the 25<sup>th</sup>, we ask that question "Do we go with tradition and all the trimmings or make a change, maybe seafood or even a bbq"? Whatever you decide to do, it's always going to be a winner amongst family and friends. We love a cold dessert and I often make an ice-cream Christmas cake or this mango and passionfruit cheesecake. Mangoes really are magical this time of year, so let's enjoy them as the season is short.

From my family to yoursA Very Happy Christmas. Base

1 cup sweet biscuit crumbs (I like Digestives for this) ½ cup desiccated coconut 100g. melted butter

# Filling

2 x 250g cream cheese, softened at room temperature ½ cup caster sugar

grated rind and juice of 2 limes or one lemon 3 teaspoons gelatine dissolved in ¼ cup boiling water,

cooled

½ cup passionfruit pulp or the same using Barossa Valley Passionfruit Couli (available at Lean and Green Warragul)

2 chopped mangoes and 1 extra for garnish 300 mls. Cream, lightly whipped

2 egg whites, beaten to soft peaks

Garnish

Extra whipped cream, more chopped mango and passionfruit pulp or couli

Combine biscuit crumbs, coconut and melted butter. Press into a buttered and lined 22cm springform pan. Chill.

Beat cream cheese, sugar, lime rind and juice until smooth.

Add the gelatine mixture and passionfruit pulp or couli.

Fold in the whipped cream and beaten egg whites. Pour into prepared crust and refrigerate until set. Top with extra cream, mangoes and passionfruit pulp.

You can make this the day before for a stress free Christmas dessert.





## Nangara News Butterflies

As the daily temperatures start to climb, we begin to see a range of butterfly species in Nangara Reserve. Butterflies along with moths

are members of the Lepidop-

tera order, a very large order of world-wide insects. Butterflies generally rest with their wings shut, have clubbed antennae, are usually colourful and are diurnal. Moths usually rest with wings open, have 'feathery' antennae, mostly have muted colouration and are largely nocturnal. Careful – there are exceptions to eve-

ry rule!

There are four stages in the life cycle of a butterfly; egg, larvae (caterpillar), pupa (chrysalis or cocoon) and adult (butterfly). The female adult butterfly lays her eggs on a suitable plant for the hatched caterpillars to feed



on. Some species of butterfly have very specific host plants. Reputedly, the female butterfly can 'smell' her preferred host plant over more than a kilometre. As many gardeners appreciate, caterpillars are eating machines. As it rapidly grows the caterpillar sheds its outer exoskeleton, sometimes several times. Finally, it attaches itself to a twig or leaf and spins a silk cocoon around itself. Inside the cocoon, the change from caterpillar to adult butterfly magically takes place in a process known as metamorphosis.

The best time to get a close view of the butterflies in Nangara Reserve is generally early to mid-morning. Butterflies are cold-bloodied and need to warm up a little each morning before flying. They often do this in a patch of morning sun on a piece of bare ground, tree trunk or log, resting with their wings open.

Many butterflies have completely different upper and under wing patterns. The colourful upper wing patterns are thought to be for attracting mates, or in some cases for warning predators. Most under wing patterns seem to be for camouflage when the butterfly lands on some leaf litter, bark or foliage.

World-wide there are several thousand species of the subfamily of brown butterflies. There are 34 species of 'brown' butterflies in Australia, Victoria has 15 or 16 and it is easy to find at least 4 or 5 different brown butterflies in Nangara Reserve.



Butterflies are nectar-eaters and so they act as pollinating vectors for many of our native wildflowers and shrubs and many reptiles and birds prey on butterflies. The humble butterfly is a huge contributor to the

biodiversity of Nangara Reserve.

Don't become complacent about fires this summer. We have had several turnouts lately to burn-offs that have got away. Our former Captain, Firefighter Graeme Higg has wise advice about fire risks for summer and warns **'the difference between a good day and a bad day is wind'.** While it may look green, hot wind can dry things out quickly to the point where conditions can change very quickly. So be prepared.

If you are doing a burn off remember:

- \*Register your burn off online or call 1800668511
- \*You must stay by your fire and monitor it
- \*Don't burn off on windy days

This year's DWCFA"Firefighter of the Year" award (The Dale Award) recipient is Penny Jewell. Penny has been the Family Liaison Officer for many years . She gave her perspective on the impact of the fires, as a spouse and parent of CFA volunteers, to the 2009 Bushfire Royal Commission. Penny designed the station interior of the recent station extensions, and is Brigade Social Coordinator. She also cleans the station on a regular basis to ensure DWCFA remains Coronavirus-free, and was responsible for our new Brigade Apparel. Penny supported her husband Bruce, when he was Captain for 6 years. Penny was congratulated and thanked on behalf of all the members of Drouin West Fire Brigade and the Drouin West & Jindivick communities. The Brigade also congratulates Captain Brendan Witt and his wonderful wife (and CFA member) Kimmy, on the safe arrival of our newest 'member' their baby Oscar Witt, born 9th November.
