St. James' Church The season of Lent is a significant period in the Christian Calendar. It serves as a time of reflection, repentance, and preparation for Easter. It traditionally lasts for 40 days (not counting Sundays) and commemorates the 40 days that Jesus spent fasting in the desert.


Lent starts on **Ash Wednesday**, which is observed seven weeks before Easter Sunday. The name "Ash Wednesday" comes from the practice of placing ashes on the foreheads of adherents as a sign of repentance and humility. The ashes typically come from the burned palm branches from the previous year's Palm Sunday. During Lent, many Christians choose to give up certain luxuries or adopt certain practices to enhance their spiritual growth. These can include fasting, giving up certain foods or activities, increased prayer, almsgiving, or performing acts of charity.



Planned burn - State Forest near Jindivick

Forest Fire Management (FFM) has notified landholders near the State Forest of a planned burn scheduled from March to June 2025. The burn objective is to develop fuel-reduced areas of sufficient width and continuity to reduce the speed and intensity of bushfires. The target area is 20-50% of the total area i.e., 260ha to 650ha. Walkers and horse riders often use this area. The planned burn is within the non-motorised zone of the Labertouche State Forest, as shown on the map. The blue line shows the whole area. The orange dots indicate the current planned burn for this autumn (the area south of Gippsy Creek Track). Sunday the 2nd of February was a busy day for our volunteer firefighters with several fires in Jindivick started by lightning strikes to trees. We had incidents on Nangara Rd (15 appliances) and Main Jindivick Rd (7 appliances). We are trained to hit these fires quickly and efficiently, so that we minimise impact to properties.

A quick response from our brigade, assistance from surrounding brigades, aerial support and heavy machinery quickly brought these fires under control. Our members worked throughout the night to contain and extinguish the fires in preparation for hot weather the following day.

This lively session presented the concept design of a new boat ramp to be built on the western shore of the Tarago Reservoir, with access from North Jindivick Rd. Over 30 people attended and voiced many views about the proposed boat ramp and the decision by the Victorian Government to build a new boating facility at Tarago Reservoir. 


